

- The Office of Intelligence plays a central role in the FBI's counterterrorism efforts. The Office of Intelligence collects, analyzes,


and disseminates intelligence on terrorist threats.

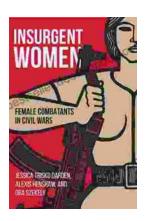
