Instructions:

1. With main color, chain 4 and join to form a ring.
2. Round 1: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), 2 dc in ring, ch 2, *3 dc in ring, ch 2; repeat from * 3 more times, join with sl st to top of ch 3.
3. Round 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), 2 dc in each ch-2 space around, join with sl st to top of ch 3.

4. Round 3: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), 2 dc in each dc around, join with sl st to top of ch 3.
5. Repeat rounds 2 and 3 until square measures approximately 10 inches square.
6. Change to contrast color and work round 4 as follows: ch 3, 2 dc in each dc around, join with sl st to top of ch 3.
7. Fasten off and weave in ends.
8. To make purse, fold square in half and sew sides together. Attach a handle to each side.

Notes:

- You can use any type of yarn you like, but worsted weight yarn is a good option for beginners.
- You can adjust the size of the purse by making more or fewer granny squares.
- You can also add embellishments to your purse, such as beads, buttons, or tassels.

1. Chain 30.
2. Single crochet in each chain across.
3. Chain 1 and turn.
4. Single crochet in each stitch across.
5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 until bag is desired length.
6. Fasten off and weave in ends.

7. To make handles, chain 20.
8. Single crochet in each chain across.
9. Chain 1 and turn.
10. Single crochet in each stitch across.
11. Repeat steps 9 and 10 until handles are desired length.
12. Fasten off and weave in ends.
13. Attach handles to sides of bag.

Notes:

- You can use any type of yarn you like, but worsted weight yarn is a good option for beginners.
- You can adjust the size of the bag by making more or fewer rows.
- You can also add embellishments to your bag, such as beads, buttons, or tassels.

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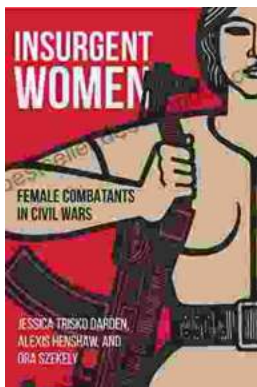
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
