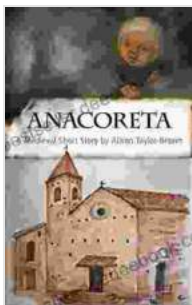


Once Upon a Hill in Tuscany: A Medieval Short Story

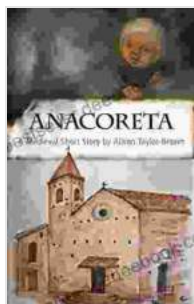
In the months that followed, Isabella slowly began to heal. She continued to pray, and she found strength in the support of her family and friends. She

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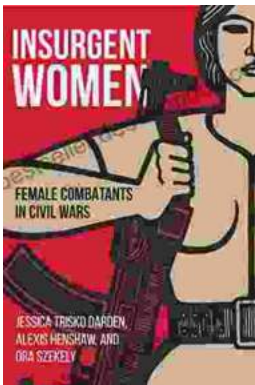
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
