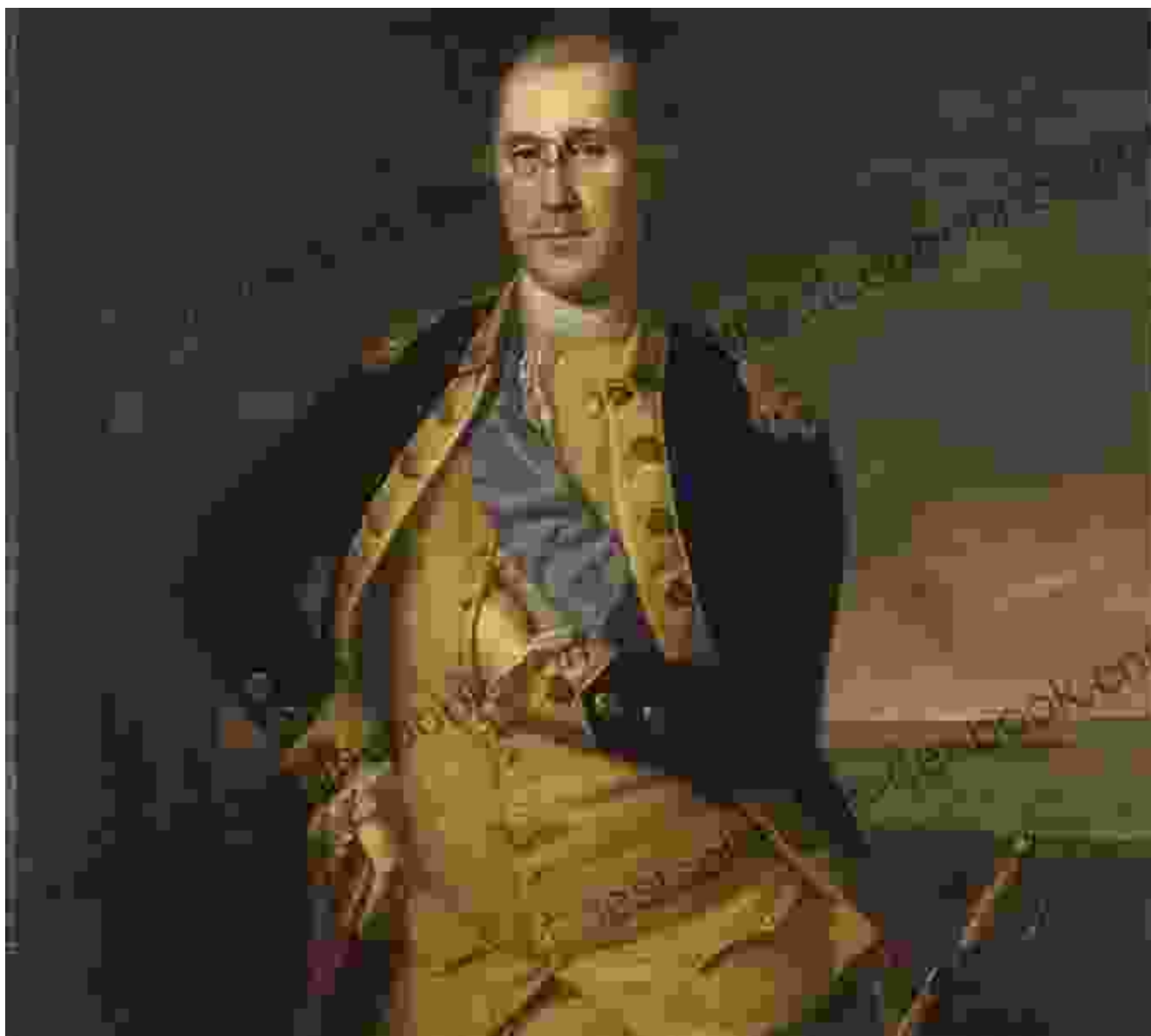

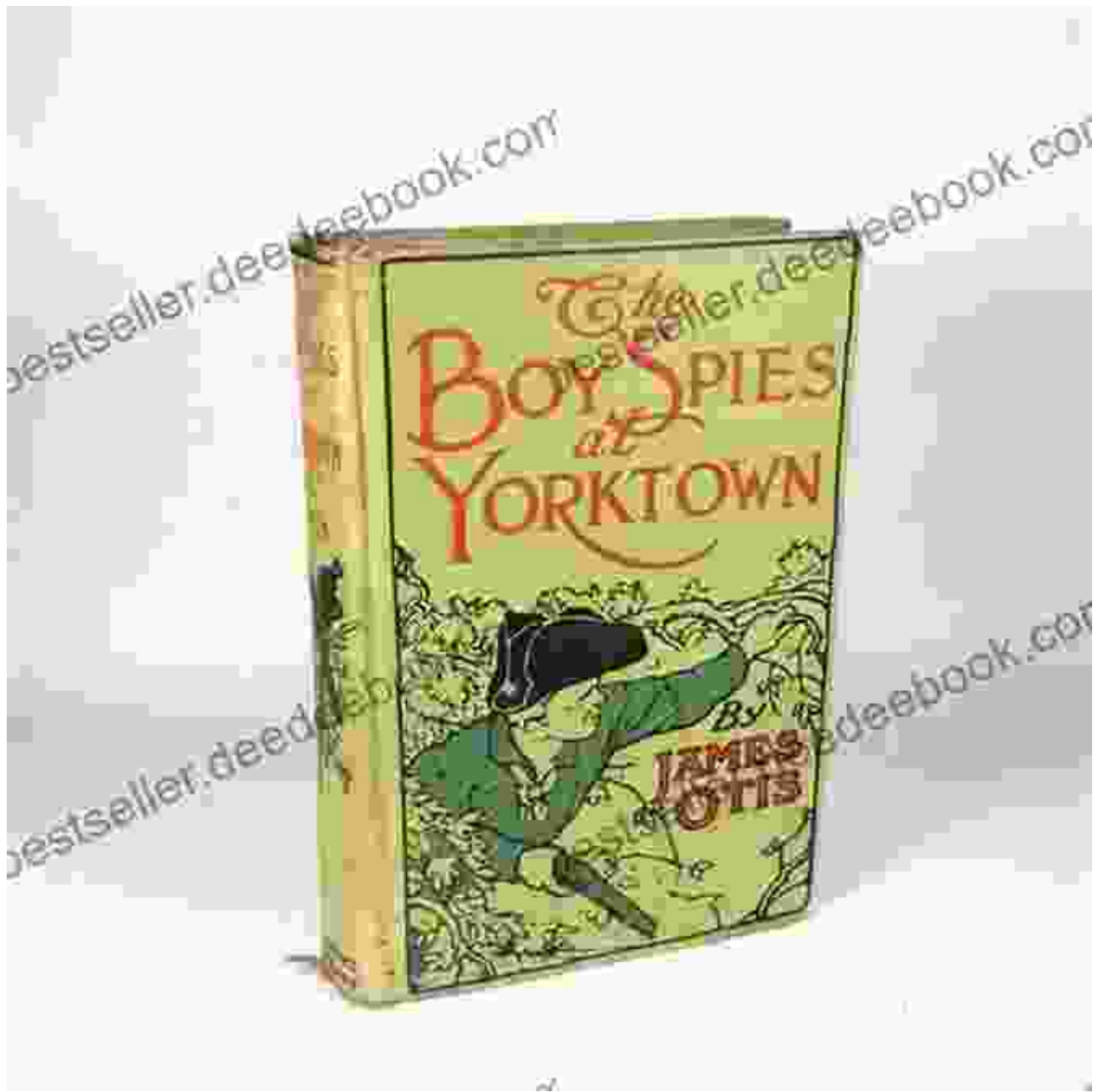

The Code That Changed History

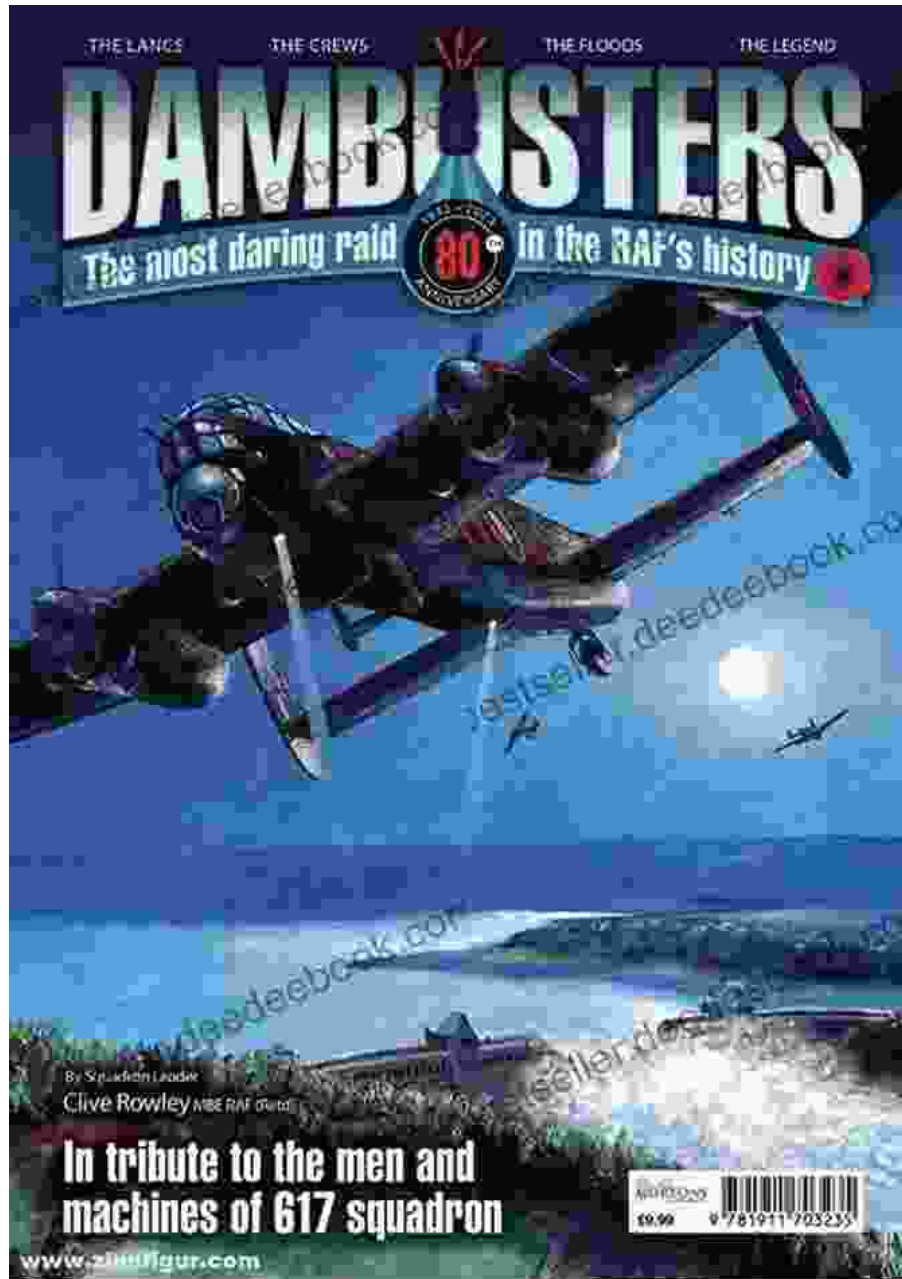

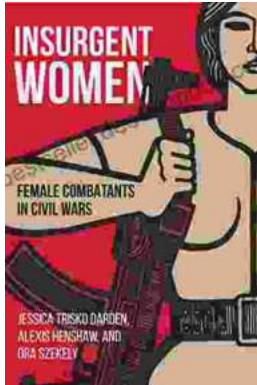
