



The Bowline Knot

KNOTS THAT CONNECT THE LINE TO A SUPPORT

HALF HITCH

- ① Wrap the line around the point of support.
- ② Take the working end around the standing line and through the loop.
- ③ Pull the working end to tighten and secure the knot.

This quick and easy knot is the basis for many other nautical knots. While it isn't reliable on its own, it's used in combination with other knots to create a line system tying down boats.

DOUBLE HALF HITCH

- ① Wrap steps 1 and 2 for the half hitch knot.
- ② Wrap the working end around the standing line again and through the loop.
- ③ Pull the working end to tighten and secure the knot.

This is a more secure version of the half hitch and is used to tie up a boat securely. It's a good option for keeping boats from moving in their slips.

CLOVE HITCH

- ① Wrap the line around the support point of contact.


CLEAT HITCH

- ① Wrap the line around the first turn of the cleat.


The Square Lashing


